CECILIA

Cecilia Kyalo collected 120 eggs in 2 weeks from her Rainbow Rooster chickens – an improved variety that grows faster and is more robust. She is able to sell fertilized eggs and chickens, and in turn uses that income to buy more day old chicks; she also produces meat and eggs for her family and community. Cecilia sells chickens for \$6 each, and recently made \$300 selling 50 birds. This is enough to provide for two terms of school in Kenya! The eggs provide additional income at \$0.15 per egg and are helping to spread improved genetics.
