2020 PROJECTIONS

MISSION HOPE

- Maintain support for 160 secondary students
- Continue support for 31 high school graduates through transitional programming
- Maintain support for 70 students at Kakuswi, 17 high school students, 1 college student
- Support feeding program and staffing at schools in Nairobi slums - 120 students
- Kakuswi staff housing complete
- Mission Hope service trip: 27 participants

MISSION GROW

- Complete initial programs in Eastern Kenya; support advanced development
- Continue expansion into Western Kenya
 - o Targeting 450,000 individuals over 4 years
- Continue to support development of methodology plan for global impact

MISSION BREATHE

- Continue stove and fuel expansion in Mozambique and South Africa
 - o Pilot rollout in April

Joseph Maithia has seen a 100% increase in his mango fruit production after implementing good soil and crop management techniques, such as pruning, timely spraying, controlling fruit flies and proper application of manure. He picked 24,000 fruits from his 40 trees this year! He invested \$1.70 into each tree (\$67 total), and will benefit from a profit of \$1,613 USD.
